

HAROLD CARDINAL ESSAY PRIZE FOR ABORIGINAL STUDENTS

Donor: Athabasca University

Description of Award

These prizes are awarded annually in recognition of outstanding achievement by Athabasca University (AU) undergraduate students for written work on the preservation of Aboriginal and treaty rights. An original essay formally submitted for coursework from any AU undergraduate program, which was marked or graded are considered eligible for submission. The original essay must be properly documented and formatted. Applicants must be of Aboriginal descent and must also be able to demonstrate commitment to Aboriginal rights, a history of advocacy for Aboriginal people, and contribution to community, law, politics, or government as they pertain to Aboriginal people.

Harold Cardinal (Cree, Sucker Creek First Nation) was a visionary and advocate for Aboriginal peoples in Canada. He was an author, a teacher, a lawyer and a scholar. His books "The Unjust Society: The Tragedy of Canada's Indians" and "The Rebirth of Canada's Indians" were pivotal to the understanding of Aboriginal/Non Aboriginal relations upon their release in 1969 and 1977, respectively.

Conditions of Eligibility

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be eligible to apply for these scholarships:

- Be a current AU undergraduate student.
- Be in good academic standing.
- Include an original essay formally submitted for course work from any AU undergraduate program, which was marked or graded.
- Has not been a previous recipient of the Harold Cardinal Essay Prize for Aboriginal Students.
- Be of Aboriginal descent as defined by the applicant's Indigenous nation of origin.
- Submission of the fully completed application form and required reference letter to the AU Student Awards Unit.

- Receipt of Reference Letter as instructed in section D of this application form.

Selection Criteria

The Harold Cardinal Essay Prize will be awarded to students who are able to demonstrate the following;

- Commitment to Aboriginal peoples and their rights.
- A history of advocacy for Aboriginal people.
- Contribution to Indigenous community, law, politics, or government.
- High quality original essay.
- A community reference.
