

Indigenous Graduate Award 2017-2018

The Alberta Innovation and Advanced Education (AIAE) Indigenous Graduate Award is intended to encourage a larger proportion of Indigenous Albertans to pursue and complete graduate studies in Alberta. Doctoral or Master's degree program students are eligible to apply.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Indigenous Ancestry – Students must be Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nation, Métis or Inuit. Students must provide proof of their Indigenous ancestry. *Refer to Appendix 'A'*
2. Students must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada and an Alberta resident. *Refer to Appendix 'A'*
3. Students must be actively enrolled in a Doctoral or Masters program at AU.
4. Students must be enrolled in at least 60% of a full course load.
5. Students are eligible for the award during any year of their program.
6. Students must be in satisfactory academic standing as determined by AU.
7. Students are eligible to apply a maximum of two times per academic year.

Selection Criteria

1. Essay response on a topic such as leadership, community engagement, volunteerism, career plans upon graduation etc.
2. Program GPA

Appendix A

Indigenous Graduate Award

Applicable graduate programs include;

- Doctor of Business Administration
- Doctor of Education in Distance Education
- Master of Arts
- Master of Business Administration
- Master of Counselling
- Master of Education
- Master of Health Studies
- Master of Nursing
- Master of Science

Indigenous Ancestry – Students must be Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nation, Métis or Inuit.

Students must provide proof of their Indigenous ancestry. Acceptable forms of proof include one of the following;

- Certificate of Indian Status, a status card or a valid band membership card
- Letter from their band verifying their status
- Métis membership card or letter issued by the Métis Nation he or she is registered with
- Letter or membership card from the Métis Settlements General Council
- A certified copy of a Nunavut Trust Certificate card or Inuit beneficiary card
- Letter of support from Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) or Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated
- For a non-status person, a letter of support from a FNMI organization

Students must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada and an Alberta resident.

As defined by AIAE, an Alberta Resident is;

- A person who has maintained permanent residence in Alberta for a period of 12 months immediately prior to attending a post-secondary institution, or
- A person whose parents or guardians have maintained permanent residence in Canada for 12 consecutive months and reside in Alberta, or

- A person whose spouse/partner is an Alberta resident, or
- A person declared, or who falls within a class of persons declared, to be a resident in Alberta by the Minister.

Clarification on particular cases may be determined by AU in consultation with AIAE.

Full Time Eligibility

To be eligible to apply, students must be enrolled in full time studies. This means at least 60% of a full course load.

You must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada and an Alberta resident. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The value of this award can range between a minimum of \$7,500 to a maximum of \$15,000. Schools determine the specific amount to award each eligible applicant. |
| Eligible School Requirement | Other Eligibility Criteria (if required) |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You must be attending a participating public post-secondary school in Alberta. | |
| Course Load and Study Requirements | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You must be enrolled in the 2016-17 Fall and/or Winter semester in order to be considered for these awards. A semester is defined as a study period of up to 17 weeks in length. If you complete one semester but do not continue as a full-time student, you may be eligible to receive the award but your school may adjust the award amount. You must be enrolled in at least 60% of a full course load. If you are a student with a documented permanent disability, you can be eligible if you are enrolled in at least 40% of a full course load. Your school determines what constitutes a full-time course load in each program. Co-op students, students in brokered programs, and students who are participating in an official exchange may be eligible. You must be in satisfactory academic standing as determined by your school - satisfactory academic standing may vary in how it is determined by school or program. You are not eligible to receive the award if you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> withdraw from studies, or drop from full-time to part-time studies before the award is paid | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You must be enrolled in a master's degree or doctoral degree program that is approved by the Minister of Advanced Education. | |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You must apply to the school you are attending. Check with your school for application deadlines. If you are a co-op student, a student in a brokered program, or participating in an official exchange, you must apply through the school that will issue your post-secondary credential. | |

- for a non-status person, a letter of support from a First Nations, Métis or Inuit organization
